Venue registration

In October, all tennis venues will need to meet five Safeguarding Minimum Requirements to be officially registered with the LTA.

This is a positive move and one that will help venues to create a safe, accessible, enjoyable and welcoming environment for everyone.



The five minimum standards are:

- (1) A Safeguarding Policy that has been clearly communicated to all involved at the venue.
- (2) A Diversity & Inclusion Policy that has been clearly communicated to all involved at the venue.
- (3) A Welfare Officer who has undergone the necessary training (Steff Johnston).
- (4) Satisfactory Criminal Records Checks for all relevant volunteers, staff, coaches and officers of the venue.
- (5) An annual Risk Assessment of the venue and its facilities.

Defibrillator



The Club has purchased a defibrillator, which will be accessible to everyone using the tennis courts. It will be fitted within the next 8 weeks and we will be offering a 2-hour course that covers use of the equipment and CPR.

The training is not compulsory because the equipment is designed to be used without any training and you cannot make a mistake when using the defib. However the training increases awareness and confidence, so look out for more information in the coming weeks.

Floodlit league

In Spring this year, three matches were played on Sundays at 5pm. Two teams of four played in each match with a total of 12 players taking part.

All the matches were fun but competitive and gave players of different standards the opportunity to put into practice everything they have learned at coaching sessions.

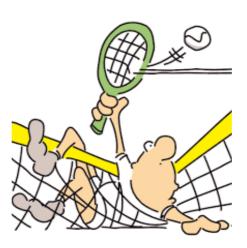
